## IFLA Buenos Aires 22-27 August 2004 Activities of the Section

### Standing Committee Meetings

The Standing Committee met twice, on August 22 and August 28, 2004. The Committee was pleased to welcome many guests to its deliberations.

**Nancy E. Gwinn**, Smithsonian Institution Libraries (USA), thanked soon to be departing member, Christelle Quillet (France), for her participation and work with the section, and welcomed new member, Danielle Mincio (Switzerland). She advised that the Section now has four corresponding members including former Section Chair, John McIlwaine, who has agreed to continue work with the section.

### Report of the Chair

**Nancy E. Gwinn** reviewed the first open session *Safeguarding our documentary heritage: do national libraries have a disaster plan?* sponsored by the IFLA Core Activity on Preservation and Conservation (PAC) with the National Libraries and Preservation and

Conservation Sections. It focused on disaster planning in national libraries. One part, presented by Marie-Thérèse Varlamoff (Director, IFLA-PAC) was a report of the results of the survey of disaster planning efforts in national libraries, which the IFLA-PAC office completed with project funding support from our section.

The second open session *Sights and sounds: preserving the new media* sponsored by the Preservation and Conservation Section with the Audiovisual and Multimedia Section, organized by Mark Roosa (USA), P&C Standing Committee member, with the Audiovisual and Multimedia Section was very successful with 280 attendees for Part 1 and 200 attendees for Part 2. There was very good cross-sectoral attendance. The committee thanked Mark Roosa in absentia for his excellent work, and Beatriz Haspo from the Library of Congress who assisted with the open session.



*P&C Section meeting deliberations*

Chair Gwinn has sent committee members the *IFLA Criteria for Section Review* whose intent is to strengthen section work within the framework of IFLA priorities. Within Division VI, the IT Section will be the first section to be reviewed. A final review schedule will be issued in late 2004.

The editing of *Preparing for the Worst, Planning for the Best: Protecting our Cultural Heritage from Disaster*, the proceedings of the IFLA Berlin 2003 special conference, is being finalized by Chair Gwinn and Information Coordinator Wellheiser, and will be submitted as IFLA Publication 111 to KG Saur by the end of 2005.

#### **Report of the Information Coordinator**

**Nancy E. Gwinn** (USA) reported for **Johanna Wellheiser**, Toronto Public Library (Canada). Two newsletters were issued in the past year, December 2003 and June 2004. Section members are encouraged to submit news notes, information on conferences and training. The e-distribution of the newsletter works well, with IFLA headquarters receiving eight print copies.

#### **Report from IFLA Division VI Coordinating Board**

**Majlis Bremer-Laamanen**, Helsinki University Library (Finland), reported news from the Coordinating Board meeting of Division VI, Management and Technology. The chair of the division, Nancy E. Gwinn, was asked to put forward three to five conference papers for publication in the IFLA Journal. The Section nominated the Buenos Aires open session *Sights and sounds: preserving the new media* papers from Brazil and Uruguay. Starting in January 2005, the IFLA Journal will be published by Sage Publishers (UK) under a new agreement signed in Buenos Aires.

Chair Gwinn pointed out a new IFLA dues structure that allows more library associations to become members of IFLA. The membership dues of library associations will be based on their annual operating budgets.

#### **Report on Register of Standards**

With John McIlwaine (UK) as lead, section members have developed a comprehensive register of preservation standards with over 400 entries since the IFLA Berlin 2003 meetings. John McIlwaine reported that a draft was sent to standing committee officers for review in May 2004. The online distribution and continuing development of this register was discussed, and while a database version is desirable, it is not

currently feasible. It was agreed that the register is an important tool and that it should be mounted on IFLANET in PDF format. The committee thanked John McIlwaine for his excellent work. Further discussion is planned for the Oslo 2005 section meetings.

#### **IFLA Core Activity on Preservation and Conservation (PAC)**

**Marie-Thérèse Varlamoff** (Director) reported that PAC activity has grown substantially during the year. There are now altogether 11 PAC centres around the world. New PAC centres have been established in Latin America and the Caribbean, one at the National Library of Brazil in Rio de Janeiro, one at the National Library of Chile in Santiago, one at the National Library of Trinidad and Tobago in Port of Spain. A new centre has also been established at the National Library of Bénin in Porto Novo. This recent activity further builds upon PAC's growing worldwide network. The December issue of *International Preservation News* issue will focus on disaster

preparedness. Input from P&C section members is always welcome. It is also planned that a basic manual on disaster planning will be developed and published.

In the United States, the Library of Congress PAC centre will be building a preservation network of Spanish-speaking librarians to provide assistance to Latin American countries.

PAC will be organizing a focused preservation training course in the French language for international librarians. Details will be forthcoming.

#### **Report on Register of Standing Committee Expertise**

**Hans Jansen** (The Netherlands) distributed his impressive compilation of the preservation expertise derived from his survey of committee members. The intent is to identify and gather together expertise and interest information to be used for future planning purposes. It is planned that the documents will be mounted on the section website. The committee was very appreciative of the work done to date.

#### **Word Summit on the Information Society (WSIS)**

**Danielle Mincio** (Switzerland) introduced the work of the WSIS, and requested assistance in enhancing the cultural heritage preservation component of the WSIS. The committee was very supportive of this initiative, and it was agreed that PAC centres would provide preservation information by early 2005 generated from PAC centres, national libraries, IFLA headquarters request for information and DIGICULT. #### **Future Congresses**

- **IFLA Oslo 2005**

The Section, with the Newspapers Section and the National Library of Norway, is organizing a two-day preconference **Arctic Circle Conservation Colloquium: Preservation Storage Solutions for all Library Materials** to be held at Mo I Rana, National Library of Norway, August 10-11, 2005. The program will focus on Norway's

preservation policy planning, and storage and preservation of traditional and new media collections. Majlis Bremer-Laamanen (Finland) and Kjersti Løkken (Norway) will continue their preparations with Ed King, secretary of the Newspapers Section.

It was agreed to offer an open session provisionally entitled **Housing for Eternity: Sustainable Solutions and Mistakes to Avoid** with presentations on environmental and preservation perspectives on library housing solutions. The Committee and IFLA/PAC will sponsor the session with the Asia/Oceania Section. The committee working group consists of Maria Louisa Cabral (Portugal), Per Culhed (Sweden), Kjersti Løkken (Norway), and Sarah Toulouse (France).

- **IFLA Seoul 2006**

The Section decided to pursue with the Continuing Professional Development and Workplace Learning Section an open session provisionally entitled **Preservation for Non-professionals: Management Tools for Enhancing In-house Preservation Knowledge**. The working group of Per Culhed (Sweden), Svetlana Dobrusina (Russian Federation), Daniel Mincio (Switzerland), Christelle Quillet (France) and Sarah Toulouse (France) will continue development of the session.

- **IFLA Durban 2007**

A number of programme options were presented including fundraising; the library as museum; digitization and preservation policies and management; guidelines for mass preservation and exhibition. A preconference on pest management in Cape Town was also discussed. Options will be reviewed at the Oslo meeting in 2005.

### ***Disaster Planning and Response Developments***



**Torino Declaration  
Resolutions of the first Blue  
Shield International Meeting  
Torino, Italy, July 23-24, 2004**

A. Recommend that the Convention for the Protection of Cultural Property in the Event of Armed Conflict adopted at The Hague in 1954, the First Protocol of 1954 and the Second Protocol of 1999 be signed and ratified by all states parties to UNESCO and to the United Nations,

B. (1) Recommend that the United Nations and other international organisations include the protection of the movable and immovable cultural heritage, and of vital records, from destruction and displacement in the mandate of their peace support operations,

(2) Encourage national governments to include the protection of the movable and

immovable cultural heritage from destruction and displacement in the mandate of their humanitarian operations,

C. Recommend that governments and relevant organisations of the United Nations act to prevent looting and destruction of cultural heritage sites and buildings and illicit trade in cultural property,

D. Considering the importance of risk preparedness, response and recovery, recommend that cultural heritage professionals and others integrate these stages into their programmes,

E. Recommend that ICA, ICOM, ICOMOS and IFLA national members should create a National Committee of the Blue Shield, where such committees do not exist, and urge national authorities to support these committees' roles and actions to protect movable and immovable cultural heritage in the event of natural or man-made disasters, and

F. Decide to establish and strengthen the ICBS as a visible, effective entity.
