Brainchild of Judge Nelson Wolff

Designed for – not adapted to – the digital age

2 Primary Goals

- Break down barriers to reading
- Meet needs of low income communities

\$2.2 Million in Capital Expenditures – Start Up

- Savings from other capital projects
- Private donations

11 Months from concept to launch

WHY IT MATTERS


First of its kind, BiblioTech offers a digital alternative to traditional public libraries

PILOT

County-Owned facility located 3505 Pleasanton Road

- Opened to the public September 14, 2013
- Approximately 4,800 sf

Configuration:

- Digital reading room
- 2 group study rooms
- Children's area
- Lounge
- Café

Equipment includes:

- 48 deskstop computers
- 200 children's readers
- 600 e-ink readers for external circulation
- 45 Ipads available for internal use
- 10 laptops available for internal use
- 4 surface tables
- Adaptive technology


